

How blogging can support your child's learning

North (infants building) – Tuesday January 27th 3.30pm – 4.00pm

South (Junior building) – Thursday January 29th 3.30pm – 4.00pm

Each year group at Farsley Farfield has a blog that shares information with you about the learning your child is doing in class. The blogs often also show photographs of the children learning and examples of their work. Teachers regularly post links to resources and information about the topics the pupils have covered in class.

Educational research has shown that blogging can help to promote learning in a range of different ways. The aim of these meetings is to share this information and show parents how they can interact with our blogs to make them even more effective in supporting pupils' learning.

The North meeting on Tuesday will focus more on the blogs for children in Foundation and KS1, whilst the Thursday meeting will focus on KS2 blogs. However, if you cannot attend the meeting for your child's key stage, much of the information will be generic and you are welcome to attend either meeting. There is no need to attend both meetings if you have children in both buildings.

Children are very welcome to attend the meeting with you. We will be logging on to laptops and your child will be able to show you their class blog. Together, you will be able to explore the blogs and post comments.
