General Information

2. Prevent and Channel Statistics

The latest Prevent and Channel statistics were released before Christmas. This includes 'Individuals referred to and supported through the *Prevent* programme, April 2018 to March 2019 report (available <u>here</u>). This is a really interesting document with the following key points:-

- In the year ending March 2019, of the 5,738 referrals, the largest proportion of individuals were from the North East region (972; 17%) of which Leeds is part, followed by London (915; 16%).
- Of the 561 referrals adopted as a Channel case, the largest proportion were from the North West region (96; 17%), closely followed by the North East region (94; 17%).
- For referrals with concerns relating to right-wing radicalisation, the largest proportion
 of individuals referred, discussed at a panel and adopted as a Channel case were
 from the North East region.



 The North East region had the highest proportion of referrals from the Education sector (352 of 1,887; 19%).

3. NSPCC Childline Annual Review

The NSPCC has published the Childline annual review 2018/19. The review looks at what children and young people tell Childline during counselling sessions and how Childline is supporting them both online and over the phone. [Link]

4. Preventing Serious Violence: multi-agency approach

Public Health England has published guidance outlining the whole system multi-agency approach to preventing serious violence outlined in the 2018 Serious Violence Strategy. The guidance provides principles and actions for local areas to use and is intended to stimulate local action through engagement with a range of partners including: children's services and education; local academy head teachers and education networks; and local safeguarding children boards. 5. Ofsted: Study into Home Education

Ofsted has published a report looking at reasons why children and young people leave secondary school to be home-educated. Findings from a study of seven local authorities in the East Midlands show that: special educational needs, medical, behavioural or other well-being needs were the main reasons behind such a move for parents and their children. Be Involved – Online Safety Project

11. Project to Examine Attempts to Help Young People Stay Safe Online

Academics at the University of East Anglia (UEA) are looking for schools to help them conduct research into:

- How pre-teens understand the risks of using the internet
- Evaluate the effectiveness of strategies and toolkits designed to increase children's digital resilience

The project will review what is currently known and being done in the area of digital resilience and explore understanding of how nine to 12-year-olds recognise and talk about the risk of online harm and recovery from exposure to harm. The aim is to create and pilot a digital resilience scale, the first psychometric scale in this area, in order to evaluate what works well for this age group. They are looking to partner with schools to increase their sample size and develop the scale across a wider age range.
