
Farsley Farfield Primary School Show Time 2024-5

We will have about 50 tickets for each show. Children must commit to all 6 shows: they can't be 'cherry-picked'. We have selected a wide range of different shows and genres, including a musical, a family-oriented ballet, a child-friendly opera and spectacular plays including jaw-dropping puppetry. We appear to have a particularly rich mix this year...



Please note that some of the shows are

PG-rated. Parents/carers may wish to research some of the shows to determine their suitability, especially for Y5. (We have starred shows that you may wish to reflect on.)

Children travel in school minibuses (and sometimes staff or parent cars) and are supervised by school staff.

We meet in the Pudsey Civic Hall car park at the start and end of each evening performance (e.g. 6pm and 10pm, exact times TBC). Cost: £110 (free for children in receipt of Pupil Premium). We appreciate that this is a lot of money but it is also very good value for six 'West End' quality shows including transport.

Children attend in school uniform. We offer the chance to pre-order ice creams before each show. No sweets. If you really want to send a drink, make sure it is **not** in a noisy bottle.

Please read the booklet carefully before committing. Please note that one show is in Feb half term and one show is actually in the first week of September next year and current Y6 will be expected to join us despite having left in July.


Hairspray has wowed audiences in The West End and on Broadway and still packs a punch with its message of tolerance and the fight against racial discrimination.






Coraline - a musical *
